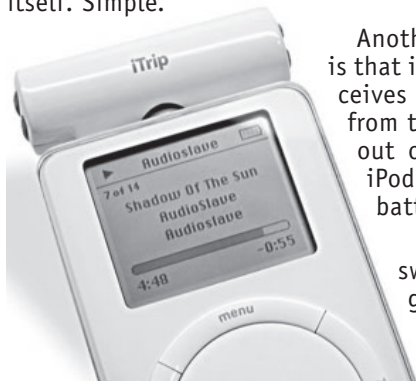

iTrip FM Transmitter for iPod [Pre-order now — shipping Spring '03]

Can't remember a user account password in Mac OS X? You can reset your passwords to gain access. To do this, boot with your Mac OS X install CD: Load it in your CD-ROM drive and hold down the 'C' key while booting. When the installer launches, look for the menu item to reset the user account passwords. *Tip from Dan Neal*
